To make music an integral part of the Gilthill learning experience for all pupils, fostering a love of music, encouraging creativity, and promoting self-expression.

INTENT 😹



- Pupils understand musical concepts through a repetition-based approach. Learning about the same musical concept through different musical activities enables a more secure, deeper learning and mastery of musical skills.
- All musical learning is built around the Interrelated Dimensions of Music: pulse, rhythm, pitch, tempo, dynamics, timbre, texture, structure and notation. These dimensions are at the centre of all of the learning.
- Pupils are offered the opportunity to appraise, perform and compose on a regular basis.

IMPLEMENTATION

- Every class from Reception to Year Six use the Charanga Original scheme to support the delivery o music lessons. Each Unit of Work comprises the of strands of musical learning which correspond with the national curriculum for music: 1. Listening and Appraising 2. Musical Activities (warm-up games, singing, playing instruments, improvisation, composition) 3. Performing
- Pupils in Reception explore music through songs and rhymes with regular opportunities to explore percussion instruments.
- Music sessions are practical, interactive and collaborative, promoting the engagement of all pupils.
- Regular opportunities to listen to music are provided in Assemblies and as part of classroom provision.
- A peripatetic music teacher offers lessons in piano or drums. School can make financial contributions to support pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium funding.
