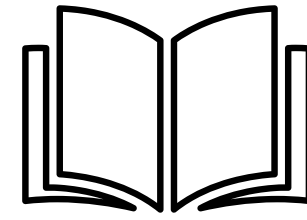




# SUBJECT ON A PAGE READING



Inspiring Today's Children To Embrace Tomorrow's Challenges

## VISION



Children will develop a love of books so that reading brings them pleasure and provide learning opportunities to embrace tomorrow's challenges.

## INTENT



Through our Reading Curriculum we aim to:

- Ensure all children develop a love of reading by providing engaging, high quality texts.
- Ensure all children have access to the school library.
- Provide opportunities for reading for pleasure, building a community of engaged readers.
- Provide children with necessary life-long skills to ensure they can read confidently and with a secure understanding.



## IMPLEMENTATION



We will implement our curriculum through:

- Ensuring in EYFS and KS1 children are taught using the Little Wandle reading and phonic scheme. The lowest 20% read extra to this.
- KS2 use the whole class reading approach while still ensuring that the lowest 20% read individually to school staff and parent helpers.
- Time is allocated twice weekly for reading for pleasure. Teachers read to the children as a story time as well as part of lessons.
- Children have access to high quality texts, which represent a range of diversity.
- Children are given time to develop comprehension skills through discussion, oracy activities and written comprehensions.

## IMPACT



We measure impact by ensuring:

- Children display an enthusiasm for reading and will choose to read for pleasure.
- A high number of children achieve the expected standard or higher, and through target intervention, those who find reading challenging are helped to catch up.
- Children read in other subject areas and as a result their skills are enhanced and understanding of the world increased.
- The impact of our reading curriculum goes beyond the result of statutory assessments and essential skills allow children to transition confidently and be able to embrace tomorrow's challenges.
